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## OUR MISSION

MOCSA exists to improve the lives of those impacted by sexual abuse and assault and to prevent sexual violence in our community.

## VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The volunteer program is vital to MOCSA and the Kansas City community. Volunteer opportunities include 24-hour crisis line, hospital advocacy, school presentations, community outreach, speakers' bureau, fundraising, and general agency support.

## 24-HOUR CRISIS LINE

The crisis line is available to anyone who has questions or needs emotional support, information, or referrals. Crisis line services are available in multiple languages 24 hours a day.

## EDUCATION

Each year MOCSA educates over 50,000 people in the Kansas City metro area. Educational presentations are available for all ages. MOCSA's education programs include:

- Project Aware: education about sexual abuse and assault for Pre-K through 5th grade
- Youth Education: education about sexual abuse and assault for middle and high school students
- Prevention Programming: long-term programming focused on culture change
- Community Education: education about sexual abuse and assault and community resources
- Professional Training: training for law enforcement, helping professionals, counseling teams and educators

## COUNSELING

MOCSA offers evidence-based counseling services to those who have experienced sexual abuse and assault. Both individual and group counseling options are offered. Outreach sites are available for most services.

MOCSA provides counseling services to anyone impacted by sexual abuse and assault including:

- Children ages 5+
- Adults including family members and significant others
- Youth with problematic sexual behaviors

## ADVOCACY

MOCSA advocates provide the following support services and assistance:

- Hospital: support during the forensic and medical exam (available 24 hours/day)
- Law Enforcement: support during the police report and investigation (available 24 hours/day)
- Court: support during criminal/civil court hearings and referrals for legal services
- Title IX: support for students and their families to prevent sexual violence from impacting their access to safe education
- Personal: help accessing needed services, support, and resources
